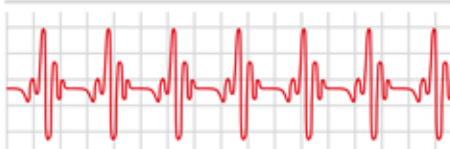
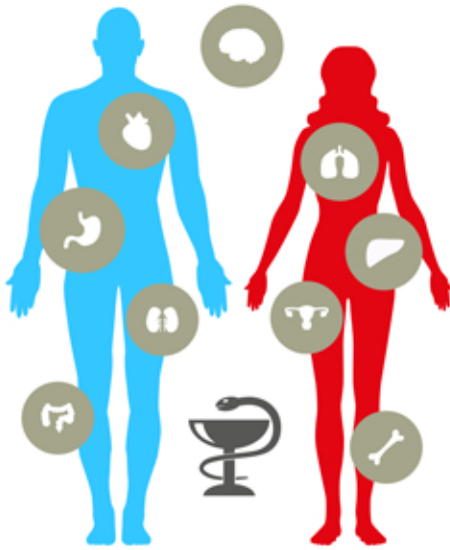
The % distribution of Females and Males assigned to the health center.

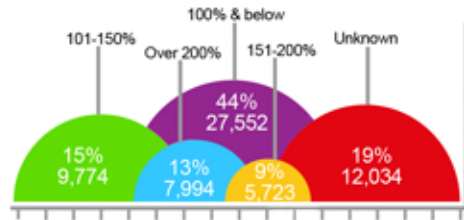


### Age Range of Health Center Patients

 Ages 65 - 85+ : 7,586 : 12%

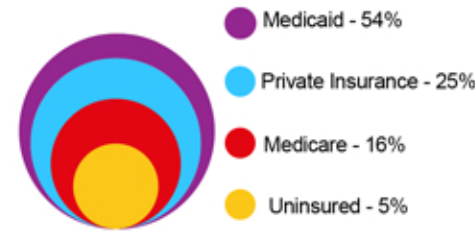


### Federal Poverty Level (FPL)

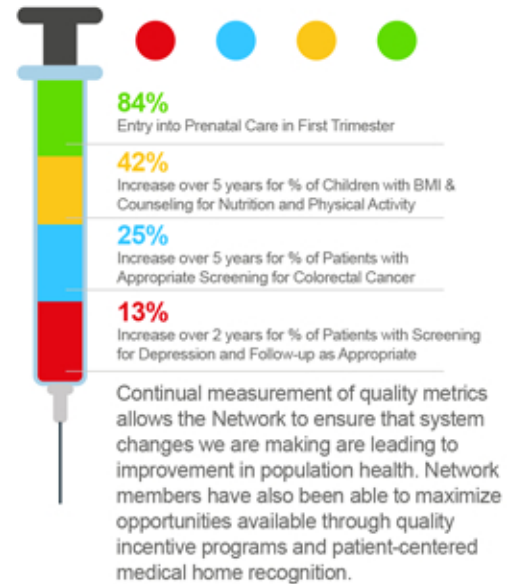
